Proceed with caution! You can guarantee it will be the biggest, most complicated, most exciting, most extraordinary idea you have ever heard. Like the idea of condensing 25 years of theatre into a two and a half hour show. With full musical score. And 31 pieces of music.

Yes folks. Thirty one.

But do keep the orchestra to a minimum Jane because here are my ideas for the set and stage....

It is truly astonishing to think our Theatre Company has been providing entertainment to the Camperdown community for 75 years. How truly amazing for such a small town. We are so fortunate to have this hub of artistic expression at our doorstep. It has been my great privilege over the past decade or more to watch young people flourish in their performance and grow from shy teenagers to superstars on stage. Our amazing director is one of those people.

I first worked with Toby when I took on my first Musical Director's role in Godspell (2011). I was asked to work with Toby on his song so I adopted my patient face, sat at the piano, played the introductory bars and waited for an amateur performance. Good grief, was I put in my place?! Tony Dupleix When the committee first considered the idea of marking our 75th with a revue of past productions, I was so relieved. At last, here was a show where I didn't have to work so hard, all the technical requirements have been done before – it would simply be a matter of dragging out old bits of scenery and reconstructing lighting effects.

Shortly after, the penny dropped. We don't keep an entire back-catalogue of scenery. We don't have much storage space, so flats and props are generally butchered to make scenes for the next production. That was the first stumbling block. It really hurts to make Hairspray scenery for this production, using the old flats from Hairspray that have been used in five productions since! And of course, it's inconceivable to think that we might still have the Addams Family torture rack, or the palm trees from The Panto Puzzle... (well actually, found those we did, that's a plus).

And then, because the theatre has changed (for the better), technology has changed (for the better) and the Director's opinion has changed (no comment), the lighting, staging and sound requirpements for each item demand that we start from scratch. Delusions of bludging rudely dismissed! Big thanks to Mick and Toby McKenzie, Paul Dunn and cast members for stepping in to help.

But what a ride it has been. I joined the Camperdown Repertory in 1977, and was shown the ropes (literally) by the master Rob Gunner and spent each performance of Love Rides the Rails nestled in the grid above stage raising and lowering scenes painted onto rolls of canvas. The next time, Rob let me hammer nails and cut wood! After that, Andrew Miller and I collaborated on scenery for years before I progressed onto lighting. Early on, Garnet Znideric worked the lights (a total of about six of them) with his homemade control board. When he left, I sort-of had to take over, and we started building up an inventory of lighting equipment. Nowadays, the possibilities with lights are nigh-on infinite and I'm delighted that young'uns like Harrison Smith and Alex Baker are keen to step up and take the magic further.

Maybe it's my perverse sense of humour, but some of my most enduring memories were moments that weren't supposed to happen. Like the Great Mirrorball Drop of Joseph. And for Travelling North (still wins the prize for the greatest number of different scenes required) I built Geoff Webber a magnificent stone and tile Spanish barbeque (out of styrofoam) complete with inserted electric frypan to grill steaks for that aromatic sensory experience, only to have the hotplate melt the foam and provide a way less appealing aroma instead!

When Egon as Teddy Roosevelt in Arsenic and Old Lace charges up the stairs and slams the door, the photos weren't meant to fall off the walls. The bomb was meant to go off in Accidental Death of an Anarchist (it did, 4 times out of 5), and in Gladly, My Cross-Eyed Bear, the kettle should have been on the stove not in a cupboard, and when filled from the tap (yes, running water on stage!) it would have been better if the tap could turn off too!





Technical Team

In another four or five years, the Theatre Royal will be 100 years old. And there will be a celebration. There are still plenty of elements of the Theatre that date back to that time with architectural features that are too good to modernise, but we're delighted that by consistently staging sell-out productions over the years we've been able to encourage Council to invest in upgrades to the old girl for the benefit and safety of both you, our audience and those who stage productions here. In the 70s and 80s, the improvement was converting the stage from raked to flat, new curtains and wiring. We had asked for a front of house lighting bar. In the 90s and 2000s we had asked for a front of house lighting bar and we saw more wiring, new auditorium lighting and phasing out the 1920s carbon-arc movie projectors with a digital replacement. More recently, the theatre was upgraded with a new auditorium floor, new seating, new sound equipment, and (drum roll) a front of house bar!! Look up. Yes, it's full, and we really could use another, but there are plenty of improvements with higher priority. I'm sure you'll agree there are times heating and cooling could be improved, and possibly the upstairs seating too?

I guess hundreds if not thousands of members have been involved with the Camperdown Repertory Society and CTC in 75 years, and we only do it because we love to. We love the challenge, and we love keeping local Theatre local. None of this would happen without the support of our community, the understanding of our families, the sponsorship from our local businesses, and people like you who keep coming back and buying tickets. We thank you for humouring us.

Behind the Scenes

Stage Management

They say that "Teamwork makes the Dream work" and nothing could be truer about our backstage crew who work together to make the magic happen.

We are truly blessed to have the beautiful Theatre Royal available to us as our performance space, but working within a historic Theatre means we do not always have access to facilities such as a fly tower to move in our sets, this means we have to come up with other ways to make this happen. The backstage crew are called upon, often at the last minute and with limited knowledge of the show to come along and make everything appear on stage at the right time and in the right place.


Working as part of the crew requires many skills. You need to be patient (there's lots of waiting for scenes to end), resourceful (can we find a way to make the impossible happen), fast (the whole set out and the new one in before the music ends), quiet (you never know when someone nearby has a microphone switched on), organised and invisible. The ability to problem solve on the fly is also very helpful.

They may never step into the spotlight (unless of course, Martinique is our choreographer) but they are all super stars!

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
Through the Years

Camperdown Theatre Company began its life as the Camperdown Repertory Society at the High School on Tuesday October 5th, 1948, with a meeting of interested parties, under the chairmanship of Mr H. L. Weaving. According to the minutes Mr Weaving explained the objects and aims of a repertory society. "All who desire will be given the chance to take part in play readings and productions. After performances members will be given the opportunity to engage in discussion over supper." Monthly play readings were an important part of the society's activities, and were run by a different member each month. The minutes were written with a fountain pen in copperplate hand. The society was incorporated in 1984, giving it a legal identity. It then became known as the Camperdown Theatre Company Incorporated, and to the present day, has upheld the traditions of the founding members.

The first production staged by the society was **Hay Fever** in May 1949.

Over the years, CRS and CTC has produced a wide variety of theatre productions at different venues across the district. Everything from dramas, comedies, operettas, one act plays, puppetry, musicals, dinner theatre and more.

The minutes from the countless meetings over the years have some recurring themes including:

- The hard work of members is vital
- Camaraderie formed during productions
- Our appreciative community
- The challenge to find enough people (particularly men) to fill all parts
- The dilemma of storage
- The need to improve facilities
- Ever increasing costs and the need to watch the budget!

The Company has long been a source of true community amateur theatre, and this longstanding volunteer tradition continues to this day.




