THE EARLY YEARS

Camperdown Theatre Company began its life as the Camperdown Repertory Society at the High School on Tuesday October 5 th. 1948, with a meeting of interested parties, under the chairmanship of Mr. H. L. Weaving. According to the minutes Mr. Weaving explained the objects and aims of a repertory society. "All who desire will be given the chance to take part in play readings and productions. After performances members will be given the opportunity to engage in discussion over supper." Monthly play readings were an important part of the society's activities, and were run by a different member each month. The minutes were written with a fountain pen in copperplate hand. The society was incorporated in 1984, giving it a legal identity. It then became known as the Camperdown Theatre Company Incorporated, and to the present day, has upheld the traditions of the founding members.

CONSTITUTION OF CAMPERDOWN REPERTORY SOCIETY
The name of the society shall be "The Camperdown Repertory Society"

Membership shall be open to all persons over the age of seventeen years.

The annual subscription shall be five shillings:

Meetings shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month.

The aims of the society shall be:

- 1. The furtherance of culture in the district, particularly having reference to drama and the allied arts.
- 2. The provision of opportunities for all members desirous of doing so, to take part in Play readings and Productions.
- 3. The provision of opportunities for discussion and social intercourse.

Office-bearers shall be:

President
Producer
3 Vice-presidents
Secretary
Treasurer
Committee of five, with power to add
Auditor

The producer shall be given authority to appoint a Theatre staff.
An account in the name of "The Camperdown Repertory Society" shall be opened in the State Savings Bank.
In the event of this society disbanding, all moneys shall be given to the

Camperdown Hospital.
